MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMON COUNCIL  
OF THE CITY OF NEW HAVEN, INDIANA

The Common Council of the City of New Haven, Indiana, met at the City Administration Building on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of November at the hour of 7:00 p.m. in a regular session in accordance with the rules of the Council.

The meeting was called to order by Council President Craig Dellinger who presided.

Craig Dellinger asked everyone to stand and recite the Pledge of Allegiance.

Title VI Statement

On call of the roll, the members of the Common Council were shown to be present or absent as follows:

Terry Werling made a motion to approve the minutes of the previous meeting as mailed. Dave Cheviron seconded the motion, and the motion was approved.

Under unfinished business item A was the third reading of Z-20-18 Ordinance Adopting the New Haven Unified Development Code. Council stated new rules would not begin till Monday November 9, 2020. Jeff Turner made a motion to have the third reading by title only Z-20-18 Ordinance Adopting the New Haven Unified Development Code. Matthew Kennedy seconded the motion, and the motion was approved by the following vote:

Deputy Clerk Jennifer Strock read by title only Z-20-18 Ordinance Adopting the New Haven Unified Development Code.

Council President Craig Dellinger declared Z-20-18 Ordinance Adopting the New Haven Unified Development Code to have passed.

Under public comments, Stacey McDaniel, 1506 Woodmere Drive, asked for a dead-end sign at Brookmont Drive. Council President Craig Dellinger said he would pass along to Superintendent Dave Jones. Stacey also asked about the results of the traffic study at Woodmere Drive and Melbourne Drive. Craig Dellinger said he would speak with Superintendent Dave Jones about it as well. Brandon Garnett, 1009 Brookdale Drive, introduced the Meadowbrook Neighborhood Watch to council. He spoke about how the group is trying to help police by being a second set of eyes not harassing neighbors. The group asked that a police officer attend a meeting so the neighborhood watch could learn what they are legally allowed to do. Chief of Police Jeff McCracken will work on getting a police officer assigned for. Council members encouraged other neighborhoods to start groups like Meadowbrook and work with police to help stop the vandalism and theft has happened recently.

Floyd Ball made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Jeff Turner seconded the motion, and the meeting was adjourned.
