### New Haven Intermediate School Needs Your Help



"HUNGER" isn't something you would think occurs in our community. Unfortunately, many children in the East Allen School System live in families who are unable to support this most basic need. Food insecurity causes stress, malnutrition, lack of concentration and poor health.

New Haven Intermediate Schools' Boomerang Backpacks Program has provided food on the weekends to needy students in grades 3<sup>rd</sup> through 5th since March 2015. During the first year of the program, 35 participants received the backpacks filled with small meals and snacks that were sent home every Friday during the school year. Currently, there are 85 students participating in the program during this 2nd year. The program has been a huge addition to our school; however, without sponsors or donations, the program will end December 2016. We are asking for your help to continue this program throughout the 2016-2017 school year.

This year, New Haven Intermediate School was named the 2016-2017 Family Friendly School by Indiana Superintendent of Public Instruction, Glenda Ritz. This is based on their commitment to addressing the needs of Hoosier students while fostering the active involvement of families and the community in their school. Family Friendly Schools must demonstrate a commitment to addressing the academic, physical, emotional and social needs of their students while providing needed resources and fostering the active involvement of families both in school and in the community.

Principal Alicia Gatewood said, "It is difficult to think of a nine year old being responsible for feeding himself/herself, but it is the reality of many families today. Unfortunately, some students are responsible for their own meals over the weekend. Boomerang Backpack provides students with a weekend of hassle free meals that are ready when students are hungry. This is their only source of a nutritious meal. Boomerang Backpacks help ease the stress of the next meal".

A donation of \$100 would sponsor a child for an entire school year; however, any amount would be greatly appreciated. Boomerang Backpacks receive monetary support through fundraising, grants and community donations. 100% of the donations go directly to the purchase of food, and are tax deductible.

## Get to Know Your City Council

### City Council

- The government of cities is divided between the mayor and the common council.
- The mayor exercises the executive authority (I.C. 36-4-4-3) of the city and is primarily concerned with its day-to-day operations.
- The Common Council exercises the city's legislative authority (I.C. 36-4-4-4) and makes the laws that govern the city and appropriates the city's monies.

• City Council members are part-time officials who serve a 4 year term and there are no term limits for City Council.

• City Council meetings are held on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of the month.

• New Haven's legislative body consists of 5 councilmanic districts and 2 at-large districts for the area.

### City Council Responsibilities

• New Haven City Council serves 2 primary functions for the City:

**Legislative Body** – City Council exercises the passage of ordinances.

**Fiscal Body** – City Council fixes the annual salaries of all elected officials of the city, establishes the annual salaries of members of the City's police and fire departments.

Council also has the authority to reduce, but not increase any other items in the city budget as submitted by the Mayor for its approval.

### Partnerships

• City Council works with Allen County officials for approval of

capital projects. (I.C. 6-1.1-29.5-10). New Haven City Council also works with Allen County Commissioners and other officials from Allen County regarding issues in New Haven.

• City Council has to abide by state statute requirements and state mandates.

• City Council members work with state elected officials on issues that affect New Haven.

### Ordinances

• An Ordinance is a local law prescribing a general and permanent rule. The introduction of an ordinance includes a summary presentation of the ordinance at a City Council meeting. Some ordinances may require public hearings. Ordinances are read and voted on 3 times prior to any passage.
