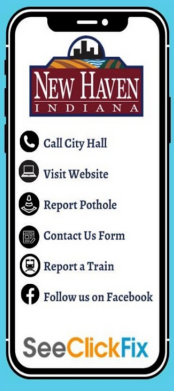

## OCTOBER IS FIRE SAFETY MONTH



- The New Haven Fire Department wants to offer some safety reminders for residents for fire safety month during the month of October.
- Be sure your house number is displayed with large numbers.
- Maintain heating equipment and chimneys by having them cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.
- Keep portable space heaters at least (3) feet away from walls and turn them off when you go to bed or leave the room.
- Keep candles at least 12 inches from anything that can burn and never leave a burning candle unattended. Blow out candles when you leave a room.
- A portable fire extinguisher can save lives and property by putting out a small fire or containing it until the Fire Department arrives.
- Test smoke alarms at least once a month using the test button. The East Central Fire & EMS Department offers free smoke detectors to residents.

## New Haven Police Department Accepting Applications for the Reserve Police Officer Program

Applications will be accepted until Friday September 30, 2022 by 4:00pm. Applicants must be 21 years of age and possess a valid Indiana driver's license. Each Reserve Officer is required to work a minimum of 16 hours per month.

Each officer receives training in Criminal Law, Firearms, Emergency Vehicle Operations, Defensive Tactics, Traffic Law, and more. This program also serves other police-related activities as directed by the Board of Control, and/or the Board of Public Works and Safety for the City of New Haven.

## WHAT YOU SHOULD DO IF YOU EXPERIENCE SEWER BACKUP PROBLEMS



As a home or business owner in New Haven, residents are responsible for their own sewer hook up to the city main. It is the City's responsibility to preserve the main sewer lines throughout the City. If you do experience sewer problems (i.e. toilets not flushing, back-ups occurring in your basement, etc.) make sure you contact the City of New Haven Utility Department first so that city crews can come out and inspect the sewer main to determine whether it is a city or homeowner issue.

Residents must contact the City of New Haven Utility Department prior to contacting a private contractor to come out and inspect the problem. If residents choose to work with a private contractor prior to contacting city officials, the City of New Haven will not be able to consider reimbursement options (if they apply) for any contractor expenses.

Once again, if you experience any sewer back up problems, you need to contact the City of New Haven prior to securing a private contractor for any sewer back up issues.

## REPORT A STREET LIGHT OUT

Do you need to report a streetlight out in your area? Residents are encouraged to contact their electric provider and report any streetlights to the customer service center.

To ensure quality service, the electric company asks that you report the pole number (if available) and the nearest address where the pole is located. Contact information for both electric providers is listed below.

The New Haven Utility Department will begin its annual leaf pick up later in October. The start date will be determined by Superintendent Dave Jones based on when leaves actually begin falling. Superintendent Jones said, "It's difficult to predict when the season will change and leaves begin to fall. For updates on leaf pick up in your area, please visit our website at [www.newhaven.in.gov](http://www.newhaven.in.gov) or go to our Facebook page sat City of New Haven Indiana."

When leaves begin to fall, please have your leaves on the park strip between the sidewalk and curb (not in the street). Please keep away from street signs, poles, mailboxes and parked cars. All leaves will be picked u as crews make their way through the city.

Bagged leaves **will not** be accepted as this will inhibit the pick-up process and the bags are not conducive to composting.

Leaves that are picked up are recycled into compost, which is available (free of charge) at the Utility Complex located at 2201 Summit Street.

\*Note: No leaf pick-up on November 11, 24 and 25. City offices are closed.

\*December - catch up throughout the city - weather permitting.
