New Haven remembers our friend and 1st District City Councilman Floyd Ball, Jr. who passed away recently in January. Floyd served on City Council and was active in the New Haven community.

Floyd received his Bachelor's degree from Purdue University and spent most of his career in management at International Harvester and later as a materials manager in the manufacturing sector.

Floyd was a U.S. Veteran serving in the United States Army and was proud to serve his country.

In 2006, Floyd was caucused into the 1st District City Council seat and served residents until the end of 2007. He ran again in 2011 and spent an additional 10 years of service on City Council serving constituents in his district. As a City Council representative, Floyd wanted to see New Haven continue to grow and be as frugal as possible. While in office, Floyd addressed issues such as the water and sewer rates and focused on public safety.

Floyd was active in the community. He attended all civic functions, including ribbon cutting ceremonies, community dedications and public events.

Floyd was a true example of honor, integrity and served the New Haven community with pride.

FEBRUARY HIGHLIGHTS

SNOW REMOVAL REMINDER

The snow plowing responsibilities of the City of New Haven are to clear the streets in a professional, safe and timely manner. City crews will begin plowing city streets when we receive 3-4 inches of snow. The first priority for snow plows is to clear the main arteries throughout the city. The snow plows will then begin removing snow from your subdivision after the snow stops.

It is the responsibility of the resident to make sure your vehicles are off the street as much as possible during a heavy snow. This enables the plows to clear the streets thoroughly and prevents your vehicle from being blocked in. It is NOT the responsibility of the city plows to come back through your street after your vehicle has been dug out and removed.

HEATING TIPS FROM The New Haven-Adams Township Fire Department

- If you have a fireplace, make sure you have your chimney cleaned and inspected annually.
- Do not use flammable liquids to start a fire.
- Using excessive amounts of paper to build your fire may ignite creosote in the chimney.
- Leave the damper open until the ashes cool down.
- Keep fireplace doors closed and screens in front of the fireplace to prevent hot embers from starting a fire.
- Test your smoke detector once a month.
- If you use a space heater, make sure it's in good working condition.
- Would your space heater automatically shut off if it were tipped over?
- NEVER fill a heater while it is running or hot, and only use the fuel recommended for your heater.
- Make sure you have your furnaces inspected annually.

WHERE TO STORE TRASH CONTAINERS

As a reminder to all residents, §52.12 (Method of Disposal for Domestic Solid Waste) of Ordinance No. G-16-8 provides that: (6) Garbage containers and recycling containers may be set out no earlier than 4:00 p.m. on the day preceding collection and shall be removed no later than 6:00 a.m. on the day following collection. (7) All garbage containers and recycling containers must be stored either inside the garage or on the side of the house at a minimum of four (4) feet behind the front of the house when not placed out for collection.

If you have any questions, please contact your New Haven City Council Representative.

City residents need to remain aware of icy road conditions during bad weather. The city typically does not salt throughout subdivisions.

Sidewalks in front of your home or business are required to be cleared by the resident or business owner.

Please remember that city ordinance prohibits throwing snow back onto streets and/or sidewalks once they have been plowed.

COLD WEATHER Prevent Your Pipes From Freezing

Below is a list of helpful hints to keep your pipes from freezing this winter.

Protect your water meter - If you have an outdoor meter pit, make sure the lid is not broken or missing. Indoor meters in unheated areas should be protected.

Keep your garage door closed - If your water meter is in an unheated garage, keep the door closed to protect it from the cold.

Insulate pipes or faucets in unheated areas - Wrapping pipes that run through unheated garages or crawl spaces may prevent freezing.

Leave the faucet running - A small steady stream of lukewarm water will help prevent pipes from freezing. This should be done at sinks where the pipes run along exterior walls.

Manufactured Homes - If you live in a manufactured home, it is recommended that you wrap and insulate your pipes rather than run the water.

Open doors below sinks - If a sink is located against an outside wall, open the cabinet doors to allow warm air to reach the pipes and prevent them from freezing.
