Happy Holidays from your New Haven City Council. 2022 was an exciting year for New Haven. Our city finalized many annexations and enjoyed a lot of housing growth. Most of the annexations were for new additions that are either under construction now or will be soon. Two of the new additions putting in roads right now are Kennebec and River Walk. Kennebec is located in the Green Road and Paulding area. It will be on 64 acres and offer 178 homes. The other new addition being constructed right now is Riverwalk which is located at Landin and South River Road. This new housing development is 60 acres and will allow 190 homes.

In addition to new projects, Victoria Lakes, Greenwood Lakes, Canal Place, Pinestone and Timber Creek are all continuing to expand. Crossroads Town Homes next to the Community Center broke ground recently and will start construction soon. We also have quite a few commercial projects in production.

As you know, Landin Road is open with full access. There are still a few things at the bridge that will require work next spring, but the road is absolutely beautiful and is a great entrance into Downtown New Haven. Many neighborhood road projects have been completed or are wrapping up for the winter season.

I'd like to thank all the sponsors and volunteers who worked so hard making our community events successful this year. Some of the most attended events were the Independence Day parade and picnic, Music, the Market & Munchies series in Schnelker Park throughout July. The Flag Day celebration, Nights on Broadway, Halloween Downtown, Holiday Homecoming, and many smaller events, make a reason to celebrate in New Haven which makes our community a great place to live, work and play.

MYAC Hosts Project HOPE with Area Corporations

The Mayor's Youth Advisory Council (MYAC) organization has been busy with volunteer projects in 2021. In addition to restoring the gazebo in Canal Landing Park earlier this spring, MYAC teens teamed up with local area corporations such as BFGoodrich, Multimatic, Continental Diamond Tool and SDI LaFarga Copperworks and challenged area corporate businesses to collect canned goods and non-perishable food items. All items were collected to benefit the St. James Food Pantry who service the New Haven area allowing any donations to go right back to the community and serve families who need assistance in New Haven, especially for the upcoming holidays. Due to the generosity of donations received by these corporations, MYAC sorted over 1,850 pounds of items donated for this event.

The Mayor's Youth Advisory Council (MYAC) organization actively participates in planning activities and opportunities for youth in and around New Haven that raise awareness of youth-related issues. MYAC also works with local officials in city government. This non-profit and non-political organization offers leadership training and life skills that teens and young adults can use as a foundation for success; including: teambuilding, organization, individuality, responsibility, decision making, networking, creativity, and public speaking skills. By offering a balance of interaction with government officials and allowing young people to give back to the community through community service projects, members benefit from positive youth development.



Seeking Nominations for the 2023 Bill Fritcha Memorial Award

New Haven has a long and proud tradition of volunteer service. Now more than ever, volunteers are renewing their commitment to help others and make new connections that bring us closer together as families, neighbors, and communities. Recognizing and honoring volunteers sets a standard of service, encourages a sustained commitment to civic participation, and inspires others to make service a part of their lives. The Bill Fritcha Memorial Award was established in 2011 to recognize the valuable contributions volunteers are making in our communities and encourage more people to serve. The Bill Fritcha Memorial Award was created as a way to thank and honor individuals by their demonstrated commitment and example, and to inspire others to engage in volunteer service.

There are three basic considerations: civic engagement, service to the community with humility, and acts of kindness unknown to most. This award is made through nominations. The nomination process shall consist of a letter of endorsement for the nominee. The letter will need to include the relationship to the nominee; examples of service to the New Haven community with humility; what impact have their volunteer efforts made in New Haven; and examples of acts of kindness that are unknown to most.

A Selection Committee will review all nominations received. Is there anything outstanding or unique about the nominee and his or her character? Has the nominee addressed important issues facing New Haven? Has the nominee made a measurable impact?

All letters of endorsement for nominee submissions must be received no later than Tuesday, January 3rd by 12:00 noon for consideration.

Christmas Tree Drop-Off Site

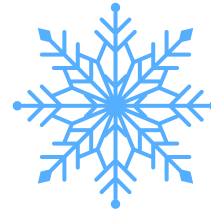

Snow Removal Reminder



The snow plowing responsibilities of the City of New Haven are to clear the streets in a professional, safe and timely manner. City crews will begin plowing city streets when we receive 3-4 inches of snow. The first priority for snowplows is to clear the main arteries throughout the city. The snowplows will then begin removing snow from your subdivision after the snow stops.

It is the responsibility of the resident to make sure your vehicles are off the street as much as possible during heavy snow. This enables the plows to clear the streets thoroughly and prevents your vehicle from getting blocked in. It is NOT the responsibility of the city plows to come back through your street after your vehicle has been dug out and removed. City residents need to remain aware of icy road conditions during bad weather. The city typically does not salt throughout subdivisions.

Sidewalks in front of your home or business are required to be cleared by the resident or business owner.

Please remember that city ordinance prohibits throwing snow back onto streets and/or sidewalks once they have been plowed.

COLD WEATHER

Prevent Your Pipes from Freezing

PREVENT YOUR PIPES FROM FREEZING

Protect Your Water Meter

If you have an outdoor meter pit, make sure the lid is not broken or missing. Indoor meters in unheated areas should be protected.

Keep Your Garage Door Closed

If your water meter is in an unheated garage, keep the door closed to protect it from the cold.

Insulate Pipes or Faucets In Unheated Areas

Wrapping pipes that run through unheated garages or crawl spaces may prevent freezing.

Leave the Faucet Running

A small steady stream of lukewarm water will help prevent pipes from freezing. This should be done at sinks where the pipes run along exterior walls.

Manufactured Homes

If you live in a manufactured home, it is recommended that you wrap and insulate your pipes rather than run the water.

Open Doors Below Sinks

If a sink is located against an outside wall, open the cabinet doors to allow warm air to reach the pipes and prevent them from freezing.
