COUNCIL CORNER

Summer is winding down and school will be in session before we know it. Just thought I'd catch you up with some of the things happening in New Haven. Landin Road is always a question people have. By the time this is published, the Rose Avenue intersection should be open. Landin will be open but with lane restrictions until they finish the paving on the bridge section. Final construction will be finishing up this fall. This project was 80% state funded which means they had the control on the contractors and schedules. The Mayor did get the lane dividers removed other than a short section before and after the railroad tracks. It's not an easy job getting the Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) to make changes to a 5 or 6 year old approved plan. This will allow drivers the chance to turn around if there's a train.

Woodmere in Meadowbrook will be starting soon. It's a total reconstruction with a new sidewalks. The contractors are in communication with our school system so that the bus drivers can plan their routes. The school parking lot will be available for Woodmere residents to park during construction and temporary mailboxes will be used.

One the home building front, the "Gateway" apartment complex will be starting soon. It will consist of 400 apartments with one car garages at 930 and Maplecrest. It's gotten delayed a bit waiting on INDOT to decide where they're going to want the configuration of that intersection to connect. Should be figured out soon. The "Crossroads" apartments will be next to the Community Center. Entrance will be from the Community Center entrance, Wayne Haven at the stoplight, or on Brookdale in Meadowbrook. These will be 135 really nice townhomes with 2-car garages. There will be a commercial development at the front by 930. Still undermined whether it will be for restaurant(s) or other.

We also have single home developments starting soon. Next Chapter Neighborhoods at Seiler and Minnich, Kennebec at Green and Paulding, and River Walk at South River and Landin. That's in addition to 29 Canal Square Townhomes on Moeller, 50 new homes in Kady Gene, and expanding Victoria Lakes, Greenwood Lakes, Pinestone and Timber Creek. There is a lot going on and the resulting increases in population will help us attract some of the amenities people have been asking for such as, restaurants, hotels, grocery stores and more.

Look also for an expansion of City Hall. With our increasing population and this administration's promise to keep increasing the number of officers in our Police force, we are out of room. Plans are being drawn up now to remodel and add more room for our Police Department. That will start this fall.

REDEVELOPMENT COMMISSION

The Redevelopment Commission promotes and implements economic development projects, acting as a catalyst to redevelop blighted areas or areas with potential growth but lack development. The commission can spur development by acquiring real estate, preparing sites for development and by extending infrastructure. The Commission consist of five voting members and one advisory member. Three members are appointed by the Mayor, two are appointed by City Council and the advisory member is appointed by the School Board of Trustees.



IMPORTANT REMINDERS FROM REPUBLIC SERVICES



Bulk item service occurs the first full week of every month. The "First full week" of the month is defined when service occurs on the first Monday through Friday of the month and service runs uninterrupted.

Residents can set out one (1) single bulk item per month which will be collected **FREE OF CHARGE**. That bulk item should be set out on your normal trash day during the first full week of the month. (This includes furniture and appliances.) Please note that for larger units such as refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, certification of refrigerant removal must be on the unit prior to pick-up by Republic Services.

Residents must contact Republic Services and schedule any bulk item for collection. There are several ways to schedule this service:

- Schedule online at www.republicservices.com
- Download the Republic Services App.

The remaining 2022 City of New Haven Bulk collection dates are as follows:

- August 1-5
- September 12-16
- October 3-7
- November 7-11
- December 5-9



Additional Bulk Items: Additional bulk items need to be pre-paid. For any additional bulk items, residents will need to purchase bulk item stickers directly through Republic Services for a one-time fee of \$20.00 per item. The City of New Haven will no longer sell bulk item stickers at City Hall.

**Residents must contact Republic Services and schedule for any extra bulk items to be collected.*

Exclusions: Electronic equipment, (i.e., televisions, laptops, computers, including monitors, keyboards, hard drives, handheld electronic devices, batteries, radio/stereo components, fluorescent bulbs) will not be collected as bulk items. Residents should contact the Allen County Solid Waste District for any electronic items at (260) 449-7265.

Trash Collection: In order to allow pick up service to run smoothly, Republic Services wants to remind all residents to set your totes and recycling totes out to the curb (with the front of the lid facing the curb for easy disposal) the night before pick-up and keep each tote 3 feet away from obstructions, including other totes, mailboxes, fences, etc.

CITY OF NEW HAVEN'S MOSQUITO SPRAYING POLICY



With your safety in mind, the City of New Haven, along with the Ft. Wayne-Allen County Department of Health, traps and tests mosquitoes. Testing starts at the beginning of the summer and lasts until late fall. The Board of Health tests for infected mosquitoes with Encephalitis. There are four types of mosquito-borne encephalitis of concern: West Nile, St. Louis, LaCrosse and Eastern Equine Encephalomyelitis. The City's spray program goes into effect when there is a positive test result. We spray the infected area with an adulticide as soon as weather permits. We do not spray for mosquitoes without a positive test because these pose no health risk. We encourage residents to protect themselves by fogging their backyard and/or spraying themselves with mosquito repellent containing deet.

The City of New Haven also treats catch basins, ponds, and standing water areas with a larvicide. This kills the mosquito larva before they can hatch.
