### "Just Look at Us Grow"

The city is experiencing a significant amount of residential growth in 2022. The New Haven Plan Commission recently approved at their March meeting two new residential developments. The first, is a new apartment complex at the southwest corner of South Maplecrest and Indiana SR 930. The new apartment complex will be called the Gateway and will feature 8 new three-story apartment buildings within its first phase.

The second, is an exciting new development from a Georgia company called Next Chapter Neighborhoods. They are planning to construct a single-family residential community which will feature unique home designs ranging from 800 square feet to 1,800 square feet. The development will include two dog parks, a playground, and additional recreation space. The development is planned for the property at the southwest corner of Seiler and Minnich Roads.

The city also anticipates that several existing subdivisions will see their remaining sections completed by the end of 2022. This includes Greenwood Lakes, Victoria Lakes, Pinestone, and Timbercreek.

## NEW HAVEN ADAMS TOWNSHIP PARK BOARD

Overall policy and management direction of the New Haven-Adams Township Parks and Recreation Department is provided by a five-member bipartisan Board of Park Commissioners, four appointed by the mayor and one appointed by an Allen County Circuit court judge, for staggered four year terms. Following provisions of Indiana statutes (I.C. 36-10-4), the Board approves budget revenues and expenditures, passes bond issues, acquires, and improves property, adopts new programs, establishes management policy and regulations, and provides a public venue for community debate and input.



## SPEED BUMPS

We all know that speeding throughout residential neighborhoods has been a problem for years. After numerous complaints of speeding in quite a few subdivisions (especially main thoroughfares), and after extensive research, the City of New Haven is in the process of administering a new policy to install "temporary" speed bumps in several subdivisions. These will be rotated in various subdivisions approximately every 6 weeks.

The purpose of these temporary speed bumps is to slow traffic down and keep residents in our neighborhoods safe. Temporary speed bumps may also be used in conjunction with local festivals to control speed and keep our citizens safe. No main arteries will have these temporary speed bumps.

The safety of our children playing, and pedestrians is our top priority; therefore, the City of New Haven has 4 sets of temporary speed bumps to be placed in various neighborhoods to slow down motorists traveling through your neighborhood. Signage will also be placed to make motorists aware that these speed bumps exist. Some area neighborhoods may see these in early spring.

Please note that these are "temporary" speed bumps which will be placed seasonally and will be removed prior to the winter months so that snow plows can easily make their way through your neighborhood and avoid any damage to the temporary speed bumps.

Neighborhoods will also have the option (at the expense of the neighborhood and ordered through the Street Department) to purchase additional temporary speed bumps that will belong to your neighborhood on a permanent basis. The process of temporary installation and removal of these speed bumps prior to winter months will remain the same.

## SUMMER WASTEWATER DISCOUNT

Customers typically use the most water during the summer months; therefore, all residential customers inside the city limits are automatically put on a discounted wastewater rate for the summer. This discount allows customers to use more water while paying less wastewater.

Each customer's discount is unique to their own usage average for the previous months of December, January, February, and March. This average becomes the wastewater cap for any water used over and above their average during the summer discount timeframe from **(May 17, 2022 - September 17, 2022)**.

Ex: Customer "A" has an average of 5,000 gallons of water from December-March. June's water usage is 8,500 gallons but they are only charged for 5,000 gallons of wastewater. They are getting a discount of 3,500 gallons on their wastewater portion of their bill.

## SEVERE WEATHER - ARE YOU PREPARED?

It's only early spring, yet we have already experienced severe weather in our area. Now is a good time to sit down with your family and talk about severe weather preparedness. Severe thunderstorms and tornadoes can occur without much warning here in the midwest, so a little preparation now can have a big impact when the weather turns bad. Here are a few tips to help keep you and your family safe in the event of severe weather.

- Develop a safe place inside your home, either in the basement or a center room such as a bathroom or closet.
- If you live in a mobile home, plan now for a safe shelter. Ask someone if you might be able to use their convention-ally built home as a shelter.
- Purchase an emergency weather radio to alert you as bad weather approaches the area.
- Be aware of local weather via television or radio and plan accordingly.
- Are you prepared if severe weather comes through your area? Stock bottled water and other essentials for your family for at least 3 days. Severe weather may cause damage to power lines or disrupt water supplies - so be prepared.

## TORNADO SIREN WARNINGS

Public safety is always our top priority. The City of New Haven now has nine Tornado Warning Sirens active throughout the community. With our extensive siren coverage, residents can expect the sirens to sound when there has been a tornado warning issued for Allen County, when New Haven is expected to be in or near the warning area, or a credible sighting has been made by trained personnel.

When activated, residents will hear a steady 3-minute tone and should take shelter immediately and tune to any radio or television for information. The sirens may be heard up to a mile if you are outside and up to half a mile if you are inside. In the event of an active warning, residents can expect the siren to be reactivated if a tornado continues to be a threat to the community. Residents are also encouraged to utilize a commercial weather radio where activation tones will alert for severe weather.

All nine sirens are tested at 12:00 noon on the first Wednesday of each month and will run for about 20 seconds. If the weather at the time of the test is threatening the test will be delayed until 12:00 noon the next day. Anytime unscheduled maintenance is needed on any of the sirens where an audible test is required, it will also be carried out only when the weather is not threatening. Many cell phones can utilize to monitor severe weather alerts.
