# COUNCIL CORNER - SUMMER IN NEW HAVEN

Welcome to Summer in New Haven. Summer means it's "cone" season. Look for a lot of road repairs and reconstruction this summer. Some of the roads that are scheduled to get attention are: Hartzell from Moeller to 930; Rose from Green to Tanglewood Drive; Linden from Rose to Summer; Summit from Linden to its end; Sherbrook from Moeller to Melbourne; Brookwood from Courtney to Genie Row; Sheridan from New Haven Avenue to its end; Seiler from Shoreline to City limits; McConnel Drive from Lincoln Hwy to its end; Homestead from Park to Prospect; Pinestone Drive from Seiler to Carmody Crossing; Short St. from Lincoln Highway to Hartzell Street; Courtney from Royalton to Brandford; and Brandford from Courtney to its end.

In addition to road construction, there is a lot of other construction going on. City Hall's Public Safety expansion is underway. The back parking lot will be closed until that's finished next year. The Tube Car Wash is under way with construction starting a few weeks ago. Several housing additions are starting and/or being added to. If you travel down Green from Moeller Road south, you'll pass Canal Place, which has very nice townhomes, then Greenwood Lakes which seems to be adding a house or five every week! Arbor Park is behind Greenwood Lakes with townhomes and duplexes. Then there's Kennebec on Green heading towards Paulding. Most of the earthwork is done and they're starting on streets. Those will be single family deluxe homes.

Heading north, River Walk is under way at Landin and North River Road. Earthwork is progressing there, and some streets are already in. Again, those will be deluxe single-family homes and some villas. Pinestone and Timber Creek are also adding new homes. Another construction project that won't be too visible will be our new filtration system going in next to Havenhurst. This will filter and discharge overflow water during heavy rain events. We're required to eliminate all overflows into the river, and this will take care of that. This has been a project that has been considered and planned for over 20 years. We finally found an affordable way to do this project and it will help keep our water and sewage costs as low as possible.

### REVEALING A PIECE OF OUR PAST

This watercolor painting of the pastoral Burgess-Schnelker house done nearly 50 years ago is now on display at the New Haven Community Center along with the history of the house and its two illustrious owners.

For 140 years this stately house stood proudly at today's S.R. 930 and Werling Road; then in 1980 it was razed. The house has been gone for over 40 years, yet nostalgic memories remain. All are invited to stop by the Community Center to see the display and embrace a piece of New Haven's bygone days.



The 41" x 17" painting, done by artist Jim McBride, dates back to 1977 shortly before the house was taken down. Herman Henry Schnelker, Jr. is the "Schnelker" of the Burgess - Schnelker House. In preparation of the Centennial Celebration of Schnelker Park last September, a team member dug into the rumor that the painting was still in existence in hopes of displaying it during the event. It was last remembered to be have been hanging in the New Haven High School Administration Office. But when they went to check, the painting wasn't there. So they went looking for help. With the help of City Council President, Craig Dellinger, and New Haven Community Foundation board member and former EACS teacher, Marilyn Stemmler, the painting was found!

Their search had led them to Harper's Funeral Home where the painting had rested in storage for years. David Rousculp, the General Manager of Harper's, had discovered the painting and put it on view where it was met with appreciative reactions from local visitors. He lent the painting for the park celebration, and it was prominently displayed.

Following the celebration, David donated the painting to the Schnelker family in exchange for a digital reproduction to hang in the funeral home. The Schnelker family refreshed the painting with a wheat motif frame and donated it to the City for posterity. The painting and its history are now on permanent view at the Community Center along with other reflections of New Haven's past. Make sure to check it out today!
