



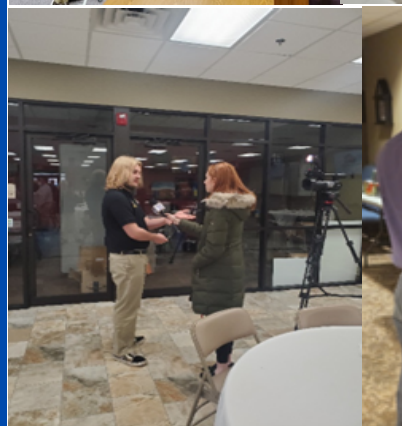

Check out the Mayor's Youth Advisory Council and learn how you can become more involved in the community, learn team building skills and have fun.

Since 2002, the New Haven Mayor's Youth Advisory Council has worked with young people who want to make a difference in the community. The MYAC organization actively participates in planning activities and opportunities for youth in and around New Haven that raise awareness of youth-related issues. MYAC also works with local officials in local government. MYAC provides a sense of purpose and offers a unique opportunity for young people. This is the place for the government and the community to get some feedback, opinions, and concerns from young people to make this community even better.

This *non-profit and non-political organization* offers leadership training and life skills that can be used as a foundation for success, including **teamwork, organization, individuality, responsibility, decision making, networking, creativity, and public speaking skills**. By offering a balance of interaction with government officials and allowing young people to give back to the community through community service projects, members benefit from positive youth development. This provides a youth voice in the community along with the skills that are necessary to become leaders. MYAC was created to build successful partnerships together for one common goal - **positive youth development for our youth of today and future leaders of tomorrow!**

Youth Advisory Councils and Commissions have been established in cities throughout the United States to work in conjunction with local government authorities. These Councils and Commissions consist of young adults who are dedicated to their community and selected by their peers to represent their communities. Youth Advisory Councils have been designed to provide an opportunity for young adults to get involved in local government affairs. MYAC members will advise the Mayor and meet with City Council members pertaining to issues that will benefit youth.

WHY GET INVOLVED?

The Mayor's Youth Advisory Council is established for those young adults who simply want to make a change that will benefit their peers and who are willing to make a serious commitment to this organization. Other reasons to get involved include:

- Gain leadership and life skills
- Open doors for opportunities with local government
- Potential internship for Youth Council members to work with various City departments on projects
- Build mutual respect between local government and young adults
- Serve as advisors to the Mayor and City Council on issues that affect our youth
- Work toward a better knowledge of local government

IS THIS FOR NEW HAVEN STUDENTS ONLY?

The MYAC organization is offered to students who live in New Haven or attend New Haven High School.

TO APPLY:

1. Complete an application (type or neatly print).
2. Application requires a signature from the student.
3. A Parent/Guardian Recommendation Form and signature is required from a parent/legal guardian for participation in this program if an applicant is under the age of 18.
4. An Adult Recommendation Form is required for **all** applicants (**Note: Other than a parent, adult recommendations may include a professor, teacher, guidance counselor, coach, guardian, relative, instructor, minister or other adult mentor.**)
5. All portions of this application need to be answered for applicant to be considered.

INTERVIEW

Once a completed application is received, it will be reviewed by the Mayor's Youth Advisory Council Committee and an interview process will begin with the Mayor and Youth Director.

MEETINGS

Youth Advisors will help administer the Mayor's Youth Advisory Council, but the Youth Advisory Council meetings will be conducted by its members. Youth Advisory Council meetings are held on the 1st and 3rd Monday of the month. Meetings will generally be held at New Haven City Hall located at 815 Lincoln Highway East in New Haven.

STATE OF THE YOUTH ADDRESS (Public Speaking)

A member of the Mayor's Youth Advisory Council shall present a "State of the Youth Address" prior to the New Haven Mayor's State of the City Address which is held each year. The purpose of the State of the Youth Address is to report on the concerns, issues, future goals, and desires of this organization, while offering suggestions and recommendations necessary to achieve those goals.

ANNUAL YOUTH FORUM (Leadership)

The Annual Mayor's Youth Council "Youth Forum" is an excellent educational opportunity offered to young people throughout the region. This Youth Forum is hosted each year by a different Youth Council and held in their community. This event is facilitated by young people to enhance their leadership skills and allows teens to network with other youth councils in the region.

The conference offers leadership development, life skills training and legislative education and an opportunity to learn from other youth councils. This regional event was initiated and produced by the New Haven Mayor's Office in 2022 along with planning, input and assistance from the Mayor's Youth Advisory Council. Although New Haven served as the first "host" city for this event, it gives other cities an opportunity to plan and host this conference in the future.

COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECTS (Civic Engagement - Volunteering)

The MYAC organization participates in various projects that benefit the community and its residents. Participating in community service projects offers young people a way to give back to the community and promotes civic engagement responsibilities in young people.
