

NEW HAVEN WATER CUSTOMERS ANNUAL FIRE HYDRANT FLUSHING SCHEDULE



The New Haven Utility Department will begin its annual fire hydrant flushing during the month of September. Please see the schedule of dates below when we plan to be in your area. When flushing occurs in your vicinity, extra precautions should be taken to ensure no problems occur in your household. On days flushing occurs in your area, please avoid doing laundry. If you cannot avoid doing laundry, please be sure NOT to wash any white clothing.

The process of flushing normally disturbs the water mains and could cause iron (rusty water) in the system. The iron will normally not last long. If iron persists in your water, open as many water sources as possible within your home and let the water flow for approximately five (5) minutes or until the water clears. If discoloring persists, please call the New Haven Water Department Office at (260) 748-7050 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. We regret any inconvenience that this may cause and appreciate your cooperation. If you have any questions, please contact Public Works Superintendent Dave Jones at (260) 748-7056.

Section I: September 22, 23, 24: All fire hydrants west of Hartzell Road (Meadowbrook, Heatherwood, Ridgeview, Woodfield, Castlerock)

Section II: September 24, 25, 26: All fire hydrants east of Hartzell Road and west of Werling Road, Valley Creek and Arrow Haven: (Cottonwood, Walnut Ridge, Lakewood, Ashford Lakes, Sturm and Woodridge)

Section III: September 29, 30 & October 1: All fire hydrants east of Werling Road and west of Green Road, not including Valley Creek and Arrow Haven: (Straford, Pinestone, Scarborough, Timbercreek, Barber's Point, Main and Powers)

Section IV: October 1, 2, 3: All fire hydrants east of Green Road and Green Street: (Highland Terrace, Tanglewood, Cameron Creek and Canal Ridge)

Section V: October 6, 7, 8: All fire hydrants north of North River Road.



2025 NEW HAVEN LEAF SCHEDULE



The New Haven Utility Department will begin its annual leaf pick up later in October. The start date will be determined by Public Works Superintendent Dave Jones based on when leaves actually begin to fall. Superintendent Jones said, "It's difficult to predict when the season will change and leaves begin to fall. For updates on leaf pick up in your area, please visit our website at www.NewHaven.In.Gov or go to our Facebook page at City of New Haven Indiana."

Where to Rake Leaves

When leaves begin to fall, please have your leaves on the park strip between the sidewalk and curb (not in the street). Please keep leaf piles away from street signs, poles, mailboxes and parked cars. All leaves will be picked up as crews make their way through the city.

Bagged Leaves

Bagged leaves will be collected, however, they must be placed in biodegradable bags. Residents will need to call (260) 748-7068 and schedule a pick up. Bagged leaves can also be dropped off at the compost site at the utility shop located at 2201 Summit Street. Once area leaf pick up begins, scheduled collections will not be guaranteed.

Compost

Once leaves are collected, they are recycled into compost. This is available free of charge and can be picked up at the utility shop.
