Indiana Landfill Laws Prohibit Acceptance of the Following Materials

- demolition, construction or discarded building materials
- trees, limbs or stumps longer than 4' (limbs must be tied in bundles)
- no items from commercial business or contractors will be accepted
- automotive parts, farm equipment or any item containing Freon
- septic, human, and animal waste

Electronic Items NOT Accepted

- cell phones
- computers
- handled electronic devices
- hard drives
- keyboards
- laptops
- monitors
- televisions

- asbestos materials
- automotive fluids
- business or industrial trash
- car batteries
- explosives
- fluorescent bulbs
- industrial hazardous waste
- infectious waste
- items containing mercury
- oil based or latex paint
- paint thinner
- pool chemicals
- radio/stereo components
- radioactive materials
- steel drums tires
- toxic household cleaners
